

About National PEO Week

- National PEO Week celebrates the key role the 500+ PEOs in the U.S. play in supporting the backbone of our economy: small and mid-size businesses. PEOs provide payroll, employee benefits, compliance assistance and HR services to more than 200,000 businesses employing more than 4.5 million people.
- PEOs take over the back-office tasks that consume time, energy and resources, enabling small businesses working with a PEO to grow two times faster, have employee turnover that is 12 percent lower and a higher business survival rate.
- National PEO Week coincides with NAPEO's annual PEO Capitol Summit, our legal and legislative conference in Washington, DC. We will be meeting with lawmakers to help them understand the important and broad impact of the PEO industry on the small business sector and the economy overall.
- PEOs around the country will also be celebrating National PEO Week in their own communities, spotlighting the key role they play in helping local businesses be successful and take care of their employees.
- There are four key audiences we hope to reach during National PEO Week: Policymakers, small and mid-size businesses, current PEO clients, and the general public.
- The first-ever National PEO Week was celebrated May 21-27, 2023. It will be commemorated during the third full week in May every year.
- National PEO Week has been officially recognized in the federal Congressional Record, courtesy of a proclamation by Rep. Erin Houchin (R-IN), a former PEO employee.
- National PEO Week has been designated as an "official week" by the National Day organization, which annually approves only 30 requests out of 25,000 applications.
- In 2024, 12 states recognized National PEO Week with an official proclamation. States: Arizona, Colorado, Georgia, Hawaii, Kansas, Kentucky, Massachusetts, New Mexico, Ohio, Oklahoma, South Carolina, and Texas.
